Here you will find the **Lost Railway Museum**, which celebrates the evolution of transportation with a special focus on the electric interurban railway.

Now imagine re-visiting this early 1900's village where the electric interurban railway system was the primary mode of public transportation, and let your imagination come to life as you explore the Lost Railway Museum.

#### Next Stop: Military History

The opening exhibit features the most comprehensive array of WWI items in the United States to honor the 100th anniversary of the war. Within this museum, there are two galleries and four timeline themed rooms, all jammed packed with artifacts like armor, weapons, literature, maps, art, and much more. They even have a replica bunker and trench that you can explore. Don't miss the exhibit with artifacts from Adolf Hitler's Eagle's Nest that our Michigan veterans brought back from WWII!

# Evening Entertainment: Illuminated Waterfalls

**The Cascades** has stood as a symbol of Jackson for over 85 years. The colors in this illuminated manmade waterfall light up the night sky, changing color with the music.

This massive landmark has captivated visitors from around the world for years, watching in awe as thousands of gallons of water flow over the waterfalls every minute. Your group will greatly enjoy the nightly shows, where the falls are set to music, and the weekly summer concerts.

#### **DAY TWO**

Start your day with a hardy old-fashioned breakfast made from scratch at Cracker Barrel! Just a few minutes' drive from many Jackson hotels and available bus parking, it's a great way to begin your trip.

Ye Ole Carriage Shop! This museum pays tribute to Jackson's automobile manufacturing heyday. Before Detroit became the face of automotive history, Jackson ruled the automobile world. Jackson's 25 car manufacturers built over ten thousand cars here, and your group can see 18 of them made between 1902 and 1954 at Ye Ole Carriage Shop.

The museum also features many other classic and historical cars and seven additional rooms housing dozens of impressive collections. You can find Coca-Cola memorabilia, motorcycles, model airplanes, gas pumps, kids pedal cars, an old-fashion soda shop display, and much more.

#### Next Stop: Downtown Jackson

The First Congregational Church is a must-see stop as it is believed it was an integral stop on the Underground Railroad. Take a step back in time to the 1890s to experience a one-of-a-kind candy shop – the **Jackson Candy & Fudge Factory**. The decorative copper ceilings, ornate lighting, scales for weighing, and brass National cash register will truly make your group feel like they are in an authentic candy shop from the turn of the century. While here, enjoy fudge, caramel corn, candied nuts, and other sweet selections made fresh each day.

Historically good taste can be found at **The Parlour** for your entire group. The Parlour opened in 1915, and since then it has grown to become one of Jackson's most iconic restaurants. The Parlour claims to serve the largest portions of ice cream, sundaes, and shakes in Michigan; they also offer more than 44 flavors of ice cream. Great ice cream coupled with a menu of All-American favorites makes The Parlour a unique experience for everyone. Bus parking is available.

Head back to your Jackson hotel to relax and refresh before heading out to enjoy an entertaining evening in Jackson.




# Evening Entertainment: A Show Stopping Tour

The Michigan Theatre has been captivating people with its extravagance since the day it opened its doors in the 1930s, and we're sure your group will be no different!

Taking a tour of this iconic Jackson landmark is the perfect ending to a day spent experiencing early 1900's history.

Before entering the theater, your group will be greeted by the Hollywood glamour of a glittering marquee, then step inside to be transported to another world. The Spanish Renaissance style is exotic and simply unlike anything you would see in a modern movie theater. From the craftsmanship on the interior plasterwork, to the ornate polychrome terra cotta façade, not a single detail was forgotten when it was designed. Even the furniture was elaborately carved out of walnut.



The upper balcony provides a bird's eye view of the architecture, allowing everyone to get a better look at the columns flanking the outer walls and the handcrafted stained-glass light fixtures. It's from here that you can really appreciate the continual efforts that go into maintaining this beautiful theater.

#### Next Stop: A Musical Journey

Musicians and music lovers will appreciate the **Conklin Reed Organ & History Museum**, where 100 antique organs are on display – many in playable condition!

Located in the old Hanover High School that was built in 1911, the museum features items that were once part of a typical day in the early 1900s, like printing equipment, postal sorting desk, manual telephone switchboard, and so much more! In addition to these unique collections, the museum has 87 acres dedicated to agricultural and rural history, which includes a newly built antique farm equipment barn, a maple sugar shack, and a sawmill.
