EXPLORING THE UNDERGROUND RAILROAD & CIVIL WAR

DAY ONE

Your group tour kicks off where the abolitionist movement started in Jackson – with the **Underground** Railroad! Located in the historic downtown area is the First Congressional Church. This Romanesque Revival Church has a long history of supporting civil rights crusades and was one of the first to pass a resolution condemning slavery.

Having seen more than just church services, this holy place of devotion has its share of stories. Your group can be like many others who have explored the sanctuary to take their guess on where exactly slaves have taken refuge. With two tall towers on either side of the front door and a number of loose floorboards, you might just be able to see the coveted hiding spots.

Steps away from the church is **Bucky Harris Park**. The now serene park was once the bustling town square where anti-slavery riots took place along with other activities that were crucial to the smooth operation of Jackson's Underground Railroad.

Next Stop: A Real Civil War Experience

Next, your group is in for a real treat as they tour the Ella Sharp Museum. A key feature of the museum is their Hillside Farm Lane, a fully-erect historic village representative of the Civil War era. Highlights include an 1860's log cabin, the Dibble one-room schoolhouse, country store, print shop, doctor's office, wood shop and the Merriman Sharp Farmhouse. As you walk up and down the lane exploring each building, you can imagine what life was like back when Michigan mustered the first volunteer regimen for the Civil War.

Another fascinating exhibit can be found inside the museum. Be sure to see the resolution table that was used during the birth of the Republican Party, which happened right on the outskirts of Jackson in 1854. The museum also features a fascinating rotation of exhibits highlighting Jackson's deep automotive history – as the original motor city, your group will love reliving the early years of the automotive industry on the gallery walls.



Jackson Station held so many slaves' tickets to freedom as they hopped aboard trains headed for the Canadian border. The oldest continually operating passenger rail station in the country, its architecture and history are sure to impress.

Take a moment to place your feet firmly on the ground where our forefathers bravely gathered at **Under the**Oaks to form the Republican Party and ignite the abolitionist movement in our country. Or learn the sacrifices and war stories of Michigan's finest at the Michigan Military Heritage Museum.
